RESOLUTION CALLING PARCEL TAX REAUTHORIZATION ELECTION, TITLED  
“PERALTA COLLEGES AFFORDABLE EDUCATION REAUTHORIZATION MEASURE”

---

WHEREAS, this measure reauthorizes voter-approved local funding at existing rates to help provide East Bay students access to high quality, affordable college education locally; and

WHEREAS, the cost of the University of California, California State University, and private colleges has continued to increase in recent years, and the Peralta Colleges provide a local safety net for higher education options without creating high-interest debt; and

WHEREAS, this reauthorization supports the Peralta Colleges’ career training programs so students can learn the skills needed to be competitive for good paying jobs; and

WHEREAS, additional funding cuts are anticipated with the federal government dismantling the U.S. Department of Education, and this measure reauthorizes a reliable, stable source of funding that is essential to the fiscal stability of our community colleges; and

WHEREAS, the existing voter-approved parcel tax will expire soon, and without reauthorization, the Peralta Colleges will lose approximately \$8 million annually that supports critical education programs, including programs that prepare students for jobs/careers and university transfer; job retraining programs to prepare students and adults for 21st century jobs; core academic programs, such as math, science, and English; and attracting and retaining high-quality faculty; and

WHEREAS, all funds from the reauthorization will continue to be used for our local community colleges and cannot be taken by the state or used for administrator salaries; and

WHEREAS, reauthorization continues the strict accountability requirements, including independent oversight by a Citizens’ Parcel Tax Oversight Committee, and independent financial and performance audits to make sure all funds are spent properly; and

WHEREAS, the citizens, taxpayers, and voters of the District have continued to approve this local funding for over 13 years, including approval of the Measure B parcel tax in 2012 and its reauthorization through the Measure E parcel tax in 2018; and

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Article XIII A and Section 2(d) of Article XIII C of the California Constitution authorize a community college district, by a two-thirds vote of the qualified electors, to impose special taxes other than *ad valorem* taxes on real property, and Section 50079.1

of the California Government Code (the “Government Code”) authorizes a community college district to impose qualified special taxes meeting certain requirements upon approval of two-thirds of the electorate voting on the proposition; and

WHEREAS, all funds raised with these qualified special taxes are spent for the benefit of students residing in our local district; and

WHEREAS, Section 1000 of the California Elections Code (the “Elections Code”) authorizes the District to conduct such an election only on an established election date; and

WHEREAS, June 2, 2026, is an established election date; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Trustees has held a public hearing after due notice regarding the parcel tax proposed by this Resolution, as required by Section 50077 of the Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the District is located entirely within the County of Alameda (the “County”), and the Alameda County Superintendent of Schools has jurisdiction over the District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Peralta Community College District as follows:

1. Recitals. This Board of Trustees hereby finds and determines that the foregoing recitals are true and correct.

2. Order of Election; Specifications of Ballot Measure. This Resolution shall stand as the order to the Alameda County Superintendent of Schools to call an election within the boundaries of the District on June 2, 2026, for the purpose of proposing to the electors of the District the proposition contained in Exhibit A hereto. The authority for the specifications of this election order is contained in Sections 5304 and 5322 of the California Education Code (the “Education Code”) and Sections 50075-77 and 50079.1 of the Government Code.

This Board of Trustees hereby requests the Registrar of Voters of the County of Alameda (the “Registrar of Voters”) to submit to the voters of the District at said election the proposition as it appears in Exhibit A.

3. Filing of Order of Election. The Secretary of this Board of Trustees is ordered to cause certified copies of this Resolution and order to be delivered not later than Wednesday, March 4, 2026, to the Alameda County Superintendent of Schools, and not later than Friday, March 6, 2026 to the Registrar of Voters and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County.

4. Formal Notice. The Alameda County Superintendent of Schools is hereby requested to prepare and execute a Formal Notice of Parcel Tax Election and consolidation order in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit B (the “Formal Notice”), and to call the election by causing the Formal Notice to be posted in every schoolhouse in the District and at three public places in the District, in accordance with Section 5362 of the Education Code, no later than

Wednesday, March 4, 2026, or to otherwise cause the notice to be published as permitted by law. The Secretary of this Board of Trustees, on behalf of and as may be requested by the Alameda County Superintendent of Schools, is authorized to cause all notices required by law in connection herewith to be published and posted, as the case may be.

5. Conduct of Election. (a) *Request to Registrar of Voters.* Pursuant to Section 5303 of the Education Code, the Registrar of Voters is required to, and is hereby requested to, take all steps to hold the election in accordance with law and these specifications.

(b) *Ballot and Voter Pamphlet.* The Registrar of Voters is requested to cause the exact wording of the Abbreviation of the Measure contained in Exhibit A-I to appear on the ballot, and to print the Full Text of the Measure contained in Exhibit A-II in the voter information pamphlet to be distributed to voters pursuant to the Elections Code. The full text of the measure is all that text in Appendix A hereto between the indicators “**BEGINNING OF FULL TEXT OF MEASURE----->>>>>**” and “**<<<<<-----END OF FULL TEXT OF MEASURE.**”

(c) *Consolidation.* The Alameda County Superintendent of Schools and the Board of Supervisors of the County are requested to order consolidation of the election with such other elections as may be held on the same day in the same territory or in a territory that is in part the same, pursuant to Section 5342 of the Education Code and Section 10400 and following of the Elections Code.

(d) *Canvass of Results.* The Board of Supervisors of the County is authorized to canvass the returns of the election pursuant to Section 10411 of the Elections Code.

(e) *Required Vote.* The proposition shall become effective upon approval of two-thirds of those voting thereon.

(f) *Election Costs.* This Board of Trustees shall pay all costs of the election approved by the Board of Supervisors of the County, pursuant to Section 5421 of the Education Code.

6. Appropriations Limit. This Board of Trustees shall provide in each year (pursuant to Section 7902.1 of the Government Code or any successor provision of law) for any increase in the District’s appropriations limit as shall be necessary to ensure that proceeds of the proposed tax may be spent for the authorized purposes.

7. Ballot Argument. The President of this Board of Trustees, or any member or members of this Board as the President shall designate, is hereby authorized, but not directed, to prepare and file with the Registrar of Voters a ballot argument in favor of the proposition contained in Exhibit A-II hereof, within the time established by the Registrar of Voters, which shall be considered the official ballot argument of this Board as sponsor of the proposition.

8. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption by a two-thirds vote of all of the members of this Board.



**“PERALTA COLLEGES AFFORDABLE EDUCATION REAUTHORIZATION MEASURE.** To continue funding for community colleges in Alameda, Berkeley, and Oakland at existing tax rates, support affordable education to prepare students for jobs/ careers and university transfer; attract/ retain high quality faculty; shall Peralta Community College District’s measure be adopted, reauthorizing the existing \$48 per parcel annually for 9 years, providing \$8,000,000 annually, with oversight, funds that cannot be taken by the state or used for administrator salaries, all benefitting local colleges?”

## II. FULL TEXT OF THE MEASURE

### BEGINNING OF FULL TEXT OF MEASURE----->>>>>

#### PERALTA COLLEGES AFFORDABLE EDUCATION REAUTHORIZATION MEASURE

This Proposition may be known and referred to as the “Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure” (the “Act”) or as “Measure \_\_\_”. *[Letter designation to be assigned by County Registrar of Voters]*

#### INTRODUCTION

This measure reauthorizes existing, voter-approved local funding that is set to expire soon, at existing rates to ensure East Bay students have access to high quality, affordable college education locally.

#### EDUCATIONAL PRIORITIES

This local, voter-approved funding provides approximately \$8 million annually to support instructional programs and student success at the Peralta Colleges. Funds generated by the reauthorization measure may be used only to augment (and not replace) existing funding and shall be used for instructional purposes only. Educational priorities may include but are not limited to supporting programs that prepare students for jobs/careers and university transfer; job retraining programs to prepare students and adults for 21st century jobs; core academic programs such as math, science, and English; and attracting and retaining high-quality faculty.

#### TERMS OF THE SPECIAL TAX

Terms and Purposes. Upon approval of two-thirds of those voting on this measure, the District shall be authorized to extend the existing parcel tax (Peralta Community College District Parcel Tax of 2012) for nine (9) years until 2036. The net effect of this measure would be to authorize the District to impose a total of \$48 in taxes per parcel annually each year between July 1, 2027, and June 30, 2036.

The qualified special tax shall be known and referred to as the “Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure.” Proceeds of the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure shall be authorized to be used to support programs that prepare students for jobs/careers and university transfer; job retraining programs to prepare students and adults for 21st century jobs; supporting core academic programs such as math, science, and math; and attracting and retaining high-quality faculty. Proceeds of the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure are to be spent exclusively for instructional purposes with classified expenditures limited to defined instructional support.

#### ACCOUNTABILITY PROVISIONS

Annual Audit. Upon the levy and collection of the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure, the Board of Trustees shall cause an account to be established for deposit of the proceeds. For so long as any proceeds of the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure shall remain unexpended, the Chancellor or Deputy Chancellor and Chief Operating Officer of the District shall cause a report to be filed with the Board of Trustees no later than December 31 of each year, commencing December 31, 2028, stating (1) the amount of Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure received and expended in such year, and (2) the status of any projects or description of any programs funding from proceeds of the tax. The report may relate to the calendar year, fiscal year, or other appropriate annual period, as the Chancellor shall determine and may be incorporated into or filed with the annual budget, audit, or other appropriate routine report to the Board of Trustees.

Citizen's Parcel Tax Oversight Committee. The Citizens' Parcel Tax Oversight Committee created by the Board of Trustees and currently serving will continue to oversee expenditures for the duration of the tax approved by this measure, pursuant to the bylaws the Board of Trustees has adopted for the Citizen's Parcel Tax Oversight Committee as amended from time to time.

Internal Planning and Accountability. During the term of the measure the Peralta Community College District staff, in cooperation with staff from each of the Peralta Colleges will develop expenditures plans in two year increments for the funds generated by the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure for approval by the Board of Trustees. At least thirty (30) days prior to approval by the Board of Trustees, the proposed expenditure plans will be provided to the Planning and Budget Council and the Participatory Governance Council for review. The Shared Governance Committees may provide recommendations with respect to the proposed expenditure plans to the Board of Trustees in writing and at a meeting of the Board of Trustees, and the Board of Trustees will consider the recommendations of the Shared Governance Committees before approving the expenditure plans. The expenditure plans will include measurable outcomes. An annual presentation on the parcel tax plans, expenditures, and progress toward student success and identified outcomes will be prepared by the Presidents of the Peralta Colleges for review by the Board of Trustees annually in October.

Specific Purposes. Funds generated by the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure may only be used to augment (rather than substitute for) funds already allocated for supporting programs that prepare students for jobs/careers and university transfer; job retraining programs to prepare students and adults for 21st century jobs; core academic programs such as math, science, and math; and attracting and retaining high-quality faculty. The funds are to be used for instructional purposes only with classified expenditures limited to defined instructional support.

Appropriations Limit. The Board of Trustees shall provide in each year (pursuant to Section 7902.1 of the Government Code or any successor provision of law) for any increase in the District's appropriations limit as shall be necessary to ensure that proceeds of the funding of the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure, and of all qualified special taxes levied by the District, may be spent for the authorized purposes and an election shall be conducted by the District for such purpose only if required by the general laws of the State applicable to

community college district qualified special taxes. This provision shall be deemed to be declaratory of existing procedures governing District expenditures.

### LEVY AND COLLECTION

The education parcel tax shall be collected by the Alameda County Treasurer-Tax Collector at the same time and in the same manner and shall be subject to the same penalties as *ad valorem* property taxes collected by the Alameda County Treasurer-Tax Collector. Unpaid taxes shall bear interest at the same rate as the rate for unpaid *ad valorem* property taxes until paid. The collection of the education parcel tax shall not decrease the funds available from other sources of the District in any period from the effective date hereof.

“Parcel of taxable real property” shall be defined as any unit of real property in the District, which receives a separate tax bill for *ad valorem* property taxes from the Alameda County Treasurer-Tax Collector’s Office. All property, which is otherwise exempt from or on which are levied no *ad valorem* property taxes in any year, shall also be exempt from the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure tax in such year.

The Alameda County Assessor’s determination of exemption or relief for any reason of any parcel from taxation shall be final and binding for the purposes of the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure. Taxpayers wishing to challenge the County Assessor’s determination must do so under the procedures for correcting a misclassification of property pursuant to Section 4876.5 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code or other applicable procedures. Taxpayers seeking a refund of the Peralta Colleges Affordable Education Reauthorization Measure paid shall follow the procedures applicable to property tax refunds pursuant to the California Revenue and Taxation Code.

### SEVERABILITY

Upon approval of this Act by the voters, should any part be found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, all remaining parts hereof shall remain in full force and effect to the fullest extent allowed by law.
