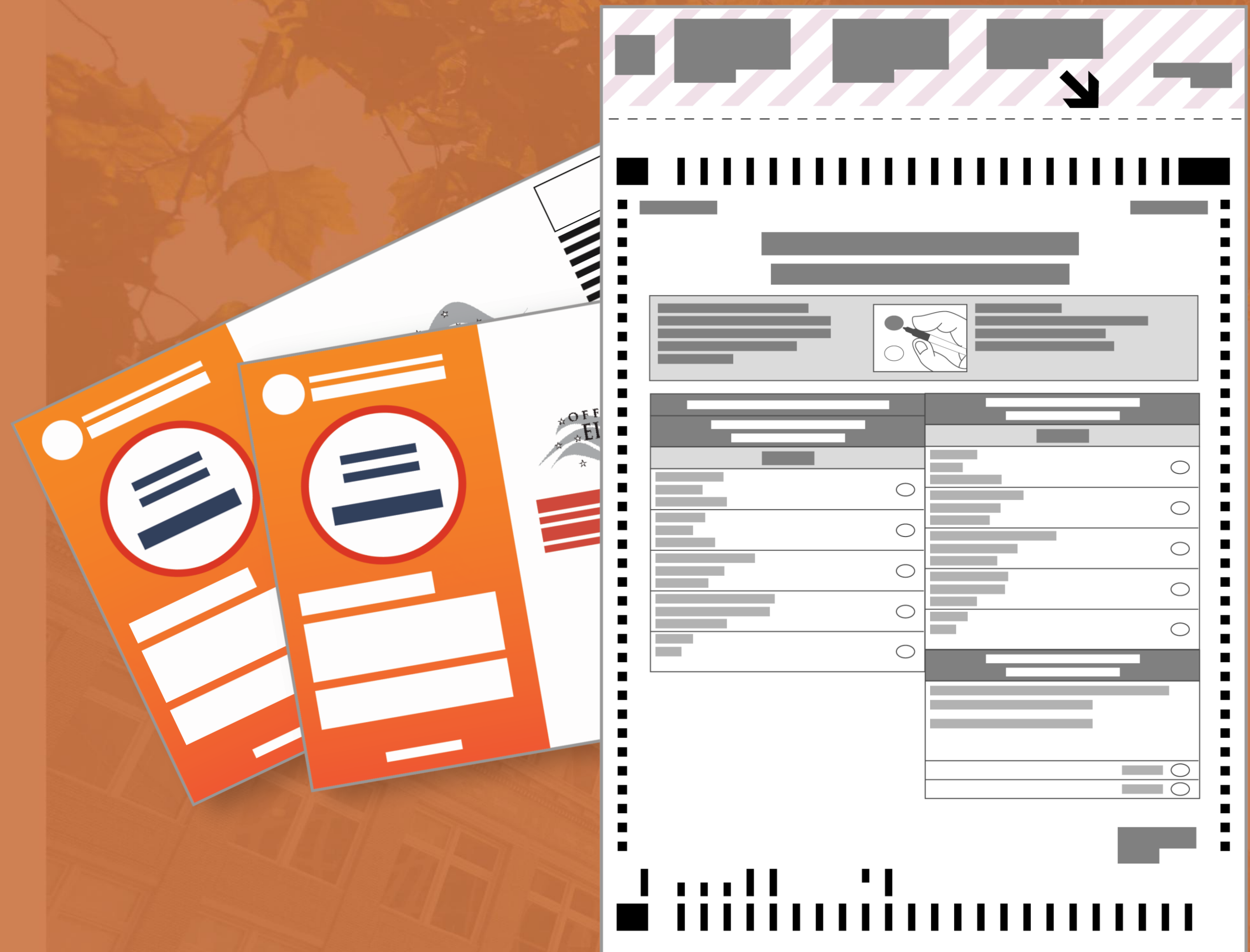

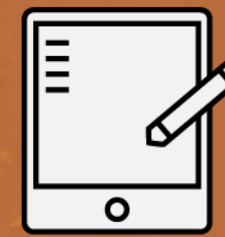

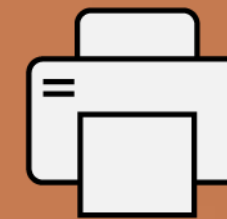

How to Vote By Mail or Sign, Seal, and Return by Election Day or VBM



Return early & direct

State Assembly Bill 37, signed into law on September 27, 2021, ensures:

every eligible voter will be mailed a ballot

Return early & direct

Where to return your VBM

- At any vote center
- Put it in the mail
- Place in any official drop box
- Drop it off at a Ballot Drop Stop

Busy? No Problem!

24-Hour Ballot Drop Boxes

- 66 Drop Boxes located in the county
- 1 Drop Box per 15,000 voters
- Open 29 days before election day

Ballot must be postmarked *on or before Election Day.*

A ballot mailed on or before Election Day must be received in ROV no later than **7 days** after Election Day. **The postmarked deadline is June 11th.**

Tracking your Vote by Mail ballot — when it is mailed, received, and counted — has never been easier.

How to Cure your ballot

If your signature does not match the one on file you will receive a letter in the mail asking you to cure your ballot. **If you are signed up for Ballot Trax, you will be messaged if your ballot needs to be cured.** For more information, call (510) 272-6973.

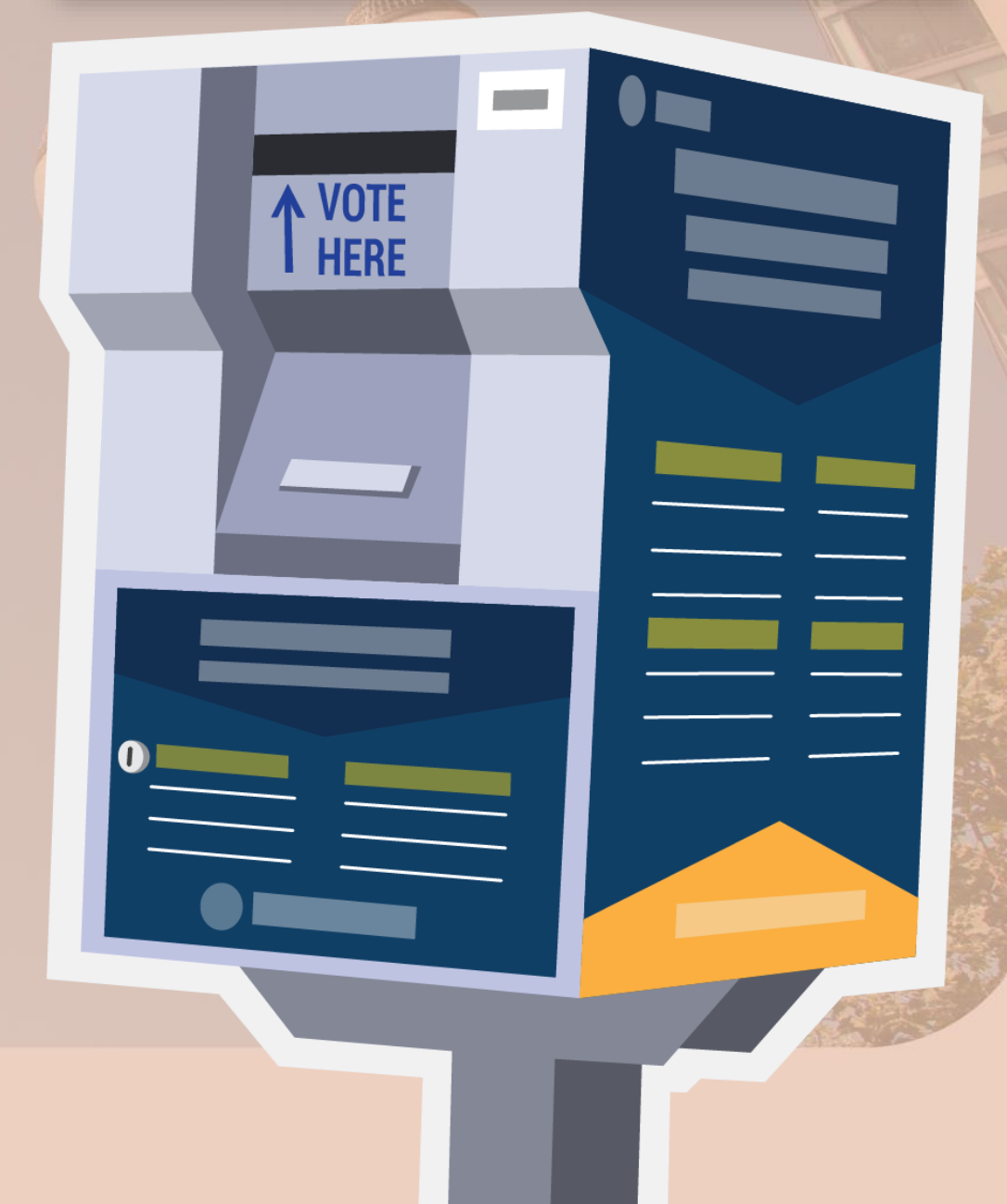

Observation

To continue transparency in the county, we offer in-person and livestreaming of the election process. We encourage observers to subscribe to updates on when election processes take place. Each morning, an email or text message will notify subscribers if an election process will be conducted that day. If no processes are scheduled, no notifications will be sent.

To subscribe to receive morning notifications about observing ballot processing during this election cycle, click the “[Subscribe here](#)” button and provide your email address or phone number (for text messages).

This schedule will remain in effect until all eligible votes have been counted.

What is a Voter Information Guide (VIG)? A Voter Information Guide is a pamphlet sent out by election offices before each election. They are filled with crucial information for voters, such as what's on the ballot, where vote centers are, and important dates for that specific election. We encourage all voters to carefully review the VIG and store it in a safe place until you're ready to vote. All ballots must be submitted via Official Ballot Drop Box, by mail, or at a vote center no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day. If you vote by mail, it must be postmarked by that deadline, so get it in early! What method will you be using to vote this election?

You don't have to wait until election day to cast your ballot. Be an early bird with us and vote early! Official Ballot Drop Boxes are open 24/7 until Election Day at 8:00 p.m. on June 2nd 2026. They're an accessible, secure, and easy way to submit your vote. All registered voters will receive a Vote by Mail ballot to their address on file.
