RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE DUBLIN UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT CALLING AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 3, 2026, FOR VOTER APPROVAL OF AN EDUCATION PARCEL TAX, ESTABLISHING SPECIFICATIONS OF THE ELECTION ORDER, AND REQUESTING CONSOLIDATION WITH OTHER ELECTIONS OCCURRING ON NOVEMBER 3, 2026

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Dublin Unified School District (the “District”), located in Alameda County (the “County”), California (the “State”), provides an excellent education to local students ranging from preschool through adult education across 14 different school sites; and

WHEREAS, the District’s high-quality education and award-winning teachers help contribute to protecting local property values; and

WHEREAS, since 2008, local voters have repeatedly supported parcel taxes to provide locally-controlled funding to protect the quality of education at local schools; and

WHEREAS, such funding is used to maintain small class sizes, attract and retain award-winning teaching staff, protect core academic programs, and support students with counseling, tutoring, and academic assistance; and

WHEREAS, the District’s parcel tax funding has not increased in 18 years even though the costs of providing a high-quality education increase every year; and

WHEREAS, local parcel tax funding is set to expire soon and, without this local funding, the District would need to make significant cuts to teachers, academic programs, and student services, impacting the level of education the District is able to provide; and

WHEREAS, the District has already made budget reductions in recent years due to increasing operating costs without adequate and commensurate State funding; and

WHEREAS, without a renewal and increase of the District's expiring parcel tax, the District will be forced to make more significant cuts, including teacher layoffs, increases in class sizes and deep cuts to academic programs; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the District (the "Board") believes that Dublin schools rely upon, and students benefit greatly from, local parcel tax funding that the state and federal government cannot take away; and

WHEREAS, funding from a parcel tax measure would help the District prioritize class size reduction; attract and retain high-quality teaching staff; provide enhanced science, technology, engineering, Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA), reading, writing and math programs for all students in all grade levels; protect student wellness and academic intervention programs; and maintain up-to-date instructional materials, classroom technology, and enhance book collections and programs at our school libraries; and

WHEREAS, the proposed measure (the "Measure") to renew and increase local parcel tax funding continues to require strict taxpayer protections, including an independent oversight committee and mandatory audits to ensure funds are spent as promised; and

WHEREAS, under no circumstances shall any of the proceeds of the education parcel tax be used for District office administrators' salaries and benefits; and

WHEREAS, homeowners 65 years of age and over and certain low-income and homeowners with disabilities receiving Supplemental Security Income or Social Security Disability Insurance would continue to be eligible for an optional exemption from the parcel tax, and will not have to reapply if they already qualify for an exemption; and

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Article XIII A of the California Constitution, and sections 50075, *et seq.*, 50079, *et seq.*, and 53722 of the Government Code, authorize a school district, upon approval of two-thirds of the electorate voting on the measure, to levy a qualified special parcel tax for specified purposes following notice and public hearing; and

WHEREAS, as with the existing parcel tax, the proposed renewal and replacement parcel tax is temporary, will automatically expire in nine years, and cannot be renewed without voter approval; and

WHEREAS, funds from the renewed parcel tax may only be used for the specific purposes described in the Measure; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code section 5342 and Elections Code section 10402.5, a school district election held on a statewide election date shall be consolidated with the statewide election; and

WHEREAS, the Board has conducted a noticed public hearing on the matters authorized by this Resolution, and now wishes to request that the County Registrar of Voters call the election and submit the Measure to the voters as provided for herein.

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE DUBLIN UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT HEREBY RESOLVES, DETERMINES AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and the Board so finds and determines.

Section 2. The Board has determined in its best judgment that an election is advisable to submit to the voters of the District the question of whether to renew and increase the existing parcel tax in order to maintain the quality of the District's public education for the benefit of all students and citizens, and on that basis hereby requests the County elections officials to call and conduct an election and submit to the voters of the District the question in the form of the Measure described herein and attached hereto.

Section 3. This Resolution shall stand as the order of election, pursuant to Education Code section 5320, *et seq.*, to the County elections officials to call an election within the boundaries of the District. The Board has the authority for ordering the election pursuant to Education Code sections 5304 and 5322, and Government Code sections 50075, *et seq.* and 50079, *et seq.* The date of the election shall be November 3, 2026, and the election shall be consolidated with the other elections occurring on that date. November 3, 2026, is an established election date pursuant to Elections Code section 1000 and is the date of the Statewide gubernatorial general election.

Section 4. The purpose of the election shall be for the voters in the District to vote on the ballot Measure, containing the question of whether the District shall impose a qualified special tax in the amounts and for the educational purposes stated therein, assessed against each parcel of taxable real property located wholly or partly in the District, a full copy of which Measure is attached hereto and marked **Exhibit A** and incorporated herein. A parcel of taxable real property shall be defined as any unit of real property located wholly or partly in the District that receives a separate tax bill for *ad valorem* property taxes from the County Tax Collector. The term of the parcel tax described in the Measure, if approved by the voters, shall be nine years from July 1, 2027.

The full text of the Measure shall appear in the ballot pamphlet (voter information guide) in substantially the form attached hereto. As required by Elections Code section 13247, the abbreviated form of the Measure to appear on the ballot is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.

Section 5. Subject to approval by two-thirds of the voters, the parcel tax shall be in the base amount of \$144 per tax year, assessed against each parcel located wholly or partly in the District, beginning as of July 1, 2027, and continuing for a term of nine years. The base amount of \$144 per parcel shall apply in the first tax year of 2027-28, and shall be adjusted annually for inflation as described in the Measure attached as **Exhibit A**. The parcel tax shall be used only for those purposes set forth in the attached **Exhibit A**. The parcel tax shall be collected by the County Tax Collector, at the same time, in the same manner, and subject to the same penalties as *ad valorem* property taxes collected by the County Tax Collector. Unpaid parcel taxes shall bear interest at the same rate until paid, and be subject to the same penalties, as for unpaid *ad valorem* property taxes.

If approved by the voters, the parcel tax described in the Measure proposed herein shall entirely supersede and replace the parcel taxes authorized by the District's voters with the approval of Measure E in 2019, and such Measure E parcel tax shall cease to be in effect as of July 1, 2027. If the Measure proposed herein is not approved by two-thirds of the voters casting ballots on the Measure, then the parcel tax authorized by Measure E will continue in effect only until June 30, 2028, at which time that parcel tax and Measure E will cease to be in effect, in accordance with the terms of Measure E.

Section 6. In accordance with guidelines established by the District, and upon satisfactory application, exemptions from the parcel tax shall be granted on any parcel owned and occupied as their primary residence by persons who are 65 years of age or older, persons receiving Supplemental Security Income for a disability regardless of age, or persons receiving Social Security Disability Insurance benefits, regardless of age, whose yearly income does not exceed 250 percent of the 2012 federal poverty guidelines issued by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

With respect to matters specific to the levy of the parcel tax, including the above-described exemptions, the decisions of the District shall be final and binding. With respect to all general property tax matters within its jurisdiction, the County Tax Collector shall make all final determinations of tax exemption or relief for any reason, and that decision shall be final and binding.

Section 7. The District Superintendent, or authorized designee, is hereby directed to send a certified copy of this Resolution to the County elections officials, the Clerk of the County Board of Supervisors, and the County Superintendent of Schools, so that said officials receive it no later than August 5, 2026.

Section 8. The County Superintendent is hereby requested to deliver this Resolution constituting the order of election, to perform applicable duties of the County Superintendent under Education Code section 5302, and to prepare and execute a formal notice of the election containing the information specified in Education Code section 5361, in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit C (the "Notice"). The District Superintendent, or authorized designee, on behalf of and as may be requested by County Superintendent of Schools, is authorized to cause all notices required by law in connection herewith to be published and posted, as the case may be.

Section 9. Pursuant to Education Code section 5303, the County elections officials are hereby requested to take all steps incidental to the preparation for and the holding of the election in accordance with law and these specifications.

The County elections official is hereby requested to reprint the full ballot text in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A in the voter information pamphlet to be distributed to voters pursuant to the Elections Code. In the event the full ballot text will not be reprinted in the voter information pamphlet in its entirety, the County elections official is hereby requested to print, immediately below the impartial analysis of the Measure, in no less than 10-point boldface type, a legend substantially as follows:

“The above statement is an impartial analysis of Measure _____. If you desire a copy of the Measure, please call the Alameda County Registrar of Voters at (510) 272-6973 and a copy will be mailed at no cost to you.”

The Board requests that the County elections officials deliver a copy of all published notices to the District Superintendent pursuant to Elections Code section 12113. The District will reimburse the County for election services as required by law.

Section 10. The Board of Supervisors of the County is authorized to canvass the returns of the election pursuant to Elections Code section 10411 and, as such, held in all respects as if there were only one election, and using only one form of ballot.

Section 11. In accordance with Education Code section 5342 and Elections Code section 10402.5, it is hereby requested that the election to be held hereunder be consolidated by the County elections officials and the County Board of Supervisors for all purposes, with any and all other elections also called to be held on November 3, 2026, insofar as said elections are to be held in the same territory or in territory that is in part the same as the territory of the District.

Section 12. The members of the Board, and the Superintendent of the District or his designee (collectively, “Authorized Officers”), are hereby authorized and directed, individually and collectively, to do any and all things and to execute, deliver, and perform any and all agreements and documents that they deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution, including, without limitation, to prepare and submit for inclusion in the voter information pamphlet an argument in favor of passage of the ballot measure, and any rebuttal argument, within the time established by the County elections officials, which shall be considered the official ballot argument of this Board as sponsor of the proposition. All actions heretofore taken by any Authorized Officer and agents of the District that are in conformity with the purposes and intent of this Resolution are hereby ratified, confirmed, and approved in all respects.

Section 13. The Authorized Officers are hereby requested and directed, individually and collectively, to provide the following accountability measures, including those required pursuant to Government Code sections 50075.1 and 50075.3, and additionally including a Citizens’ Oversight Committee, not required by law:

(a) *Specific Purpose.* The proceeds of the parcel tax shall be applied only to the specific purposes identified in the full text of the Measure (attached hereto as **Exhibit A**).

(b) *Separate Fund.* The proceeds of the parcel tax shall be deposited into a fund, which shall be kept separate and apart from other funds of the District.

(c) *Annual Report.* No later than January 1 of each year while the tax is in effect, the Assistant Superintendent of Business Services of the District shall prepare and file with the Board a report detailing the amount of funds collected and expended, and the status of any project authorized to be funded by this Measure.

(d) *Annual Audit.* The Board will conduct an annual financial audit of the proceeds of the parcel tax ensuring funds are spent for educational purposes.

(e) *Citizens' Oversight Committee.* The Board shall appoint a Citizens' Oversight Committee for the purpose of reviewing the District's expenditures of proceeds of the parcel tax to ensure they are expended for the purposes set forth in the Measure, and to report annually to the Board and the public regarding the expenditure of such proceeds.

Section 14. The Board shall provide in each year, pursuant to Government Code section 7902.1 or any successor provision of law, for any increase in the District's appropriations limit as shall be necessary to ensure that proceeds of the parcel tax may be spent for the authorized purposes.

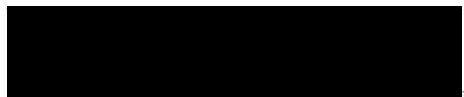
Section 15. Any Authorized Officer, or their designee, is hereby authorized and directed to execute any other documents and to perform all acts necessary to place the Measure on the ballot, including making any changes to the text of the Measure described in this Resolution, or to the abbreviated form of the Measure, or to the text of this Resolution, as may be convenient or necessary to comply with the intent of this Resolution, the requirements of elections officials, and requirements of law.

Section 16. This Resolution shall take effect from and after its adoption.

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EXHIBIT A

FULL TEXT OF BALLOT MEASURE

INTRODUCTION

The Dublin Unified School District (“District”) provides its students with a high-quality and challenging education, ranging from preschool through adult education across 14 different school sites. Our excellent teachers and outstanding staff prepare students to excel in college, their careers and the competitive economy.

Since 2008 our community has supported a local parcel tax that provides locally-controlled funding for our schools. This funding, which has not been increased in 18 years, has helped to maintain the high level of reading, writing, math and science instruction in our schools and helps retain high-quality teachers in our classrooms. In addition, this funding maintains small class sizes that allow teachers to work more closely with students. All funds received stay in the District and none of the funds received are used for District office administrators’ salaries.

The local parcel tax funding is set to expire soon. Without this local funding, the District would need to make significant cuts to teachers, academic programs, and student services, impacting the level of education the District is able to provide. The District has already made budget reductions in recent years due to substantial increases in operating costs. Without a renewal and increase of the District’s expiring parcel tax, the District will be forced to make more significant cuts, including teacher layoffs, increases in class sizes and deep cuts to academic programs.

This proposed Measure provides needed funding to maintain programs, keep class sizes small, and avoid diminishing the quality of critical educational services provided by the District.

The proposed school parcel tax is temporary, will automatically expire in nine years, and cannot be renewed without voter approval. The proposed parcel tax Measure includes an exemption for seniors and low-income people with disabilities, the only exemptions allowed by law, and are designed to ensure that the cost is not a burden to those on fixed incomes.

The proposed parcel tax Measure requires fiscal accountability protections including an independent Citizens’ Oversight Committee, annual audits and mandatory public disclosure to provide transparency and ensure funds are spent as promised.

SUMMARY STATEMENT OF THE MEASURE

“Shall the measure to support quality education, provide local funding that cannot be taken by the State, maintain small class sizes, attract/retain quality teachers, and provide enhanced science, technology, engineering, visual and performing arts, reading, writing, and math programs, by renewing the expiring \$96 school parcel tax, adding \$48 per parcel, providing approximately \$2,900,000 annually for nine years, with senior exemptions, annual inflation adjustments, independent oversight, and all funds locally controlled, be adopted?”

PURPOSE OF THE MEASURE

The District proposes to levy and collect the parcel tax annually for nine (9) years as more fully described below under the heading “RATE AND PROCEDURE,” and to implement accountability measures in connection with the education parcel tax to ensure that funds are used only for the following specific purposes:

- Attract and retain high quality teaching staff;
- provide enhanced science, technology, engineering, Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA), reading, writing and math programs for all students in all grade levels
- Prioritize class size reduction
- Protect student wellness and academic intervention programs
- maintain up-to-date instructional materials, classroom technology, and enhance book collections and programs at our school libraries

The Board of Trustees will not fund any program other than those listed above from the proceeds of the education parcel tax.

RATE AND PROCEDURE

Amount of Parcel Tax. Subject to two-thirds approval of the voters, this local funding measure and its parcel tax will be in effect for nine (9) years, commencing July 1, 2027. The parcel tax will be levied on each parcel of taxable real property (except exempt parcels, as described below), at the initial rate (base rate) of \$144 per parcel per year in the first applicable tax year, and adjusted each tax year thereafter to account in part for the impact of inflation on the cost of delivering the educational programs and services supported by the parcel tax. The inflation adjustment for each subsequent tax year shall be calculated by multiplying the prior tax year’s parcel tax rate with the annualized increase in the San Francisco-Oakland-Hayward Consumer Price Index released by the Bureau of Labor Statistics for a 12-month period preceding the beginning of the applicable tax year. In the event such index is no longer published, the Board shall adopt a comparable index of general price levels as it shall reasonably determine.

Method of Collection. The parcel tax will be collected by the Alameda County Tax Collector (the “County Tax Collector”) at the same time as and along with, and will be subject to the same

penalties as, general *ad valorem* taxes collected by said County Tax Collector. The tax and penalty will bear interest at the same rate as the rate for unpaid *ad valorem* property taxes until paid. Any tax levied will become a lien upon the properties against which taxes are assessed and collectible as herein provided.

The Board may adopt such additional or supplemental procedures as it deems necessary or convenient for the administration of the parcel tax.

Definition of Parcel. A “parcel of taxable real property” is defined as any unit of real property within the District’s boundaries that receives a separate tax bill for *ad valorem* property taxes from the County Tax Collector.

Exemptions. All property that is otherwise exempt from property taxes levied in any year will also be exempt from the parcel tax in such year. In addition, exemptions shall be available on residential parcels owned and occupied as a principal residents by the following persons, upon application to the District:

- persons who are 65 years or older;
- persons receiving Supplemental Security Income for a disability regardless of age; or
- persons receiving Social Security Disability Insurance benefits, regardless of age, whose yearly income does not exceed 250 percent of the 2012 federal poverty guidelines issued by the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

Persons qualifying for such exemptions must apply to the District for such exemption made before July 1 of the applicable tax year, under procedures established by the District or otherwise as required by law or by the Tax Collector. When an exemption has been granted to a parcel, an application for exemption will not have to be re-submitted for such exempt parcel annually, if the facts are such that said parcel continues to qualify for the exemption described in this Measure.

The District will annually provide to the County Tax Collector or other appropriate County tax officials a list of parcels that the District has approved for an exemption as provided for herein.

With respect to all general property tax matters within its jurisdiction, the County Tax Collector or other appropriate County tax official shall make all final determinations of tax exemption or relief for any reason, and that decision shall be final and binding. With respect to matters specific to the levy of the special tax, including the exemptions therefrom as described herein, the application of the definition of “parcel of taxable real property” to any parcel(s) or any other disputed matter specific to the application of the special tax, the decisions of the District shall be final and binding. The procedures described herein, and any additional procedures established by the Board shall be the exclusive claims procedure for claimants seeking an exemption, refund, reduction, or re-computation of the special tax. Whether any particular claim is to be resolved by the District or by the County shall be determined by the District, in coordination with the County as necessary.

EFFECT ON EXISTING MEASURE E PARCEL TAX

If approved by the voters, the parcel tax described in this Measure shall entirely supersede and replace the parcel taxes authorized by the District's voters with the approval of Measure E in 2019, and such Measure E parcel tax shall cease to be in effect as of July 1, 2027. If this Measure is not approved by two-thirds of the voters casting ballots hereon, then the parcel tax authorized by Measure E will continue in effect only until June 30, 2028, at which time that parcel tax and Measure E will cease to be in effect, in accordance with the terms of Measure E.

APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT

To the extent required by the California Constitution and applicable laws, the appropriations limit for the District will be adjusted periodically by the aggregate sum collected by levy of this special tax.

ACCOUNTABILITY AND COMPLIANCE MEASURES

In accordance with California Government Code sections 50075.1 and 50075.3, and as proscribed by the Board of Trustees of the District, the following accountability measures shall apply to the parcel tax levied in accordance with this Measure:

- (a) The proceeds of the education parcel tax shall be applied only to the specific purposes identified under the heading "PURPOSE OF THE MEASURE," above.
- (b) The proceeds of the special tax shall be deposited into a fund, which shall be kept separate and apart from other funds of the District.
- (c) No later than January 1 of each year while the parcel tax is in effect, the chief fiscal officer of the District shall prepare and file with the Board of Trustees of the District a report detailing the amount of funds collected and expended, and the status of any project, programs, or purposes identified under the heading "PURPOSE OF THE MEASURE," above.
- (d) The Board will conduct an annual financial audit of the proceeds of the special tax ensuring funds are spent for educational purposes.
- (e) The Board shall appoint a Citizens' Oversight Committee for the purpose of reviewing the District's expenditures of proceeds of the education parcel tax to ensure they are expended for the purposes set forth under the heading "PURPOSE OF THE MEASURE," above, and to report annually to the Board and the public regarding the expenditure of such proceeds.

PROTECTION OF FUNDING

Current law forbids any decrease in State or federal funding to the District resulting from the adoption of a parcel tax. However, if any such funding is reduced or affected because of the adoption of this local funding measure, then the Board may reduce the amount of the special taxes levied as necessary in order to restore such State or federal funding and/or maximize the District's

fiscal position for the benefit of the District's educational programs. As a result, whether directly or indirectly, no funding from this Measure may be taken away by the State or federal governments.

SEVERABILITY

The Board of Trustees of the District hereby declares, and the voters by approving this Measure concur, that every section, paragraph, sentence and clause of this Measure has independent value, and the Board of Trustees and the voters would have adopted each provision hereof regardless of every other provision hereof. Upon approval of this Measure by the voters, should any part be found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, all remaining parts hereof shall remain in full force and effect to the fullest extent allowed by law.

**ANALYSIS BY THE COUNTY COUNSEL FOR THE COUNTY OF ALAMEDA OF A DUBLIN
UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT SPECIAL PARCEL TAX MEASURE**

Measure I ("Measure"), a Dublin Unified School District ("District") special parcel tax measure, seeks voter approval to authorize the District to levy a nine-year special parcel tax, beginning on July 1, 2027, at the initial uniform rate of \$144 per parcel per year in the first applicable tax year, then adjusted each tax year thereafter by the percentage change in the consumer price index to account for inflation on the cost of delivering programs and services supported by the parcel tax.

The District estimates the parcel tax, if passed, will provide approximately \$2,900,000 annually. The District will use the revenue only for the purposes listed in the Measure, which include, but are not limited to: attracting and retaining qualified teachers and staff; maintaining small class sizes; providing enhanced science, technology, visual and performing arts, reading, writing, and math programs; supporting student wellness and academic intervention; and maintaining instructional materials, classroom technology, and school library collections.

If passed, as of July 1, 2027, the parcel tax will supersede and replace the District's Measure E, an existing parcel tax passed in 2019. If the measure fails, Measure E would continue until June 30, 2028, when it will cease to be in effect.

In addition to properties otherwise exempt from property taxes, the following people may apply to the District for exemptions on residential parcels owned and occupied as a principal residence: persons 65 years or older; persons receiving Supplemental Security Income for a disability; and persons receiving Social Security Disability Insurance Benefits who meet specified income requirements.

The Measure contains certain accountability provisions, including requiring the District to deposit parcel tax proceeds in a separate account, produce an annual report to the District's governing board from the District's chief fiscal officer detailing the amount of funds collected and expended and the status of any projects funded by the proceeds, and conduct an annual financial audit by the District's governing board to ensure parcel tax proceeds are spent for educational purposes. The District's governing board will also appoint a citizen oversight committee to review the District's use of parcel tax proceeds to ensure that they are expended for the purposes listed in the Measure.

A school district has the authority to levy special taxes upon approval by two-thirds of the votes cast on the special tax proposal. (Cal. Const. art. XIII A, § 4; art. XIII C, § 2; Cal. Gov't Code §§ 50075-50077, 50079, & 53722.) If two-thirds of the qualified electors voting on this Measure do not vote for approval, it will fail, and the District will not be authorized to levy the special parcel tax.

This Measure is placed on the ballot by the governing board of the District.
